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Greetings,

I want to start off by acknowledging the commendable efforts from our students and staff that have kept our school in-session during these extraordinary times. The daily efforts made to social distance, wearing face-coverings, and practice good hygiene have allowed for a successful start to the school year! As we all become more familiar with the daily procedures, we must continue to adhere to these three major components of our Health and Safety Plan to allow for continued in-person instruction.

We also want to stay proactive in our planning. Given the unique circumstances surrounding remote learning, Lenape Tech wants to test our remote instruction contingency model to ensure this capability if it would become necessary.

Lenape Tech will test the full remote learning system for students on Friday, October 9th. All students will stay at home for a single, practice day of remote learning. This practice day will help ensure that students, staff and parents are familiar with the remote instruction approach if it were to become necessary given COVID-19 conditions or appropriate circumstances. Advance notice is being provided to assist families in planning. We recognize the logistical challenges this practice day may present for families; however, we believe the practice will build confidence and reduce anxiety if a transition to remote learning becomes necessary.

Additionally, this day will allow for most Part-Time students miss minimal in-person instruction at their sending district. In planning for this day, our goal was minimizing the disruption, but also seek ways that should Lenape Tech be required to have full remote learning, we are able to uphold the expectation of strong instructional practices. Students will also be provided with a breakfast and lunch to take home on Thursday Oct 8th, ensuring each student has access to a free complete breakfast and lunch. This Remote Learning Day will count as an official school day, so attendance and completion of assignments are required.

In the coming days, each student and parent should expect to receive

1. Student/Parent Expectations for Remote Learning Handbook
2. Information regarding Food Service Options for Oct. 9th
3. Backup Assignment for each of the students scheduled classes should the online system fail.

Each of these documents will be emailed to all families, students, and as well as handed out to each student prior to Friday October 9th.
